The auditor was particularly impressed with the ingenuity of our team in designing a scaffold construction within a confined space which allowed large volumes of waste to be removed without causing excessive disruption to the neighbouring tenants.

Working as the Principal Contractor alongside Stace, KpH Deconstruction completed a 6 week strip out and enabling contract over three floors (mainly Levels 3 and 4) of a 16 storey building at 338 Euston Road in London. There were live services running through the floors which fed active offices within the building. KpH therefore had to carefully plan the removal of the redundant M&E services to make

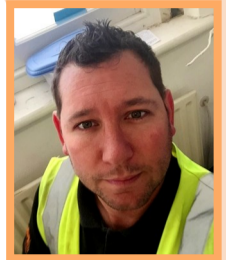


sure that there were no unauthorised disruptions for the tenants. The fire alarm system also had to be retained throughout the works. The Building Management Team operated a strict Permit to Work system and deliveries and waste skips had to be booked-in 48 hours in advance. Waste was removed out of hours in order to facilitate the needs of the building users.
